Abah Ofon is the Regional Soft Analyst for the Middle East and North Africa Region based in Dubai, UAE covering soft commodities since August 2007. In this role, Abah analyses and forecasts agricultural commodity markets including grains and vegetable oils for the bank and its global clients. He joined Standard Chartered Bank as a graduate management trainee in 1998. He worked for three years in Corporate Sales and Global Markets in Cameroon before joining the global research team in London in 2002 as Africa Economist, specializing in Francophone Africa and the Maghreb.



During this time he contributed in building the CFA franc barometer which gauges the risk for a change to the CFA franc peg to the euro. During his time as Africa economist Abah was a regular contributor to several national and international magazines including 'Jeune Afrique L'intelligent' and 'Cameroon Tribune'. His paper on China-Africa cooperation was published in 2006 by the UK's Institute for Public Policy Research (IPPR) in their book 'The New Sinosphere: China in Africa'. This formed the basis of a UK House of Commons working committee discussion in which Abah was invited to participate. Abah's analyses on the global food crisis have received wide coverage in the international media.

Abah holds a BSc degree in Economics from the University of London (Royal Holloway) and an MSc in Regional Planning from the University of London (London School of Economics). Abah is passionate about development and sits on the board of a local high school in Cameroon. He is fluent in French and his outside interests include poetry. Abah is a member of the society of business economists in the UK.
